Engineering and technical service was also provided to Grundy County Industrial Development Corp., City of Trenton, Crowder State Park, Trenton Planning Commission, Public Schools and Churches of the County.

The Grundy County Soil & Water Conservation Districts purpose is to develop and carry out a coordinated action program which will result in the conservation and improvement of the Soil, Water, Woodland and Wildlife resources in Grundy County.

To help carry out this program the District, through the Soil Conservation Service, offers planning, design, and layout of soil, water and related conservation measures. This includes parallel terraces, grassed waterways, farm ponds, erosion control structures, diversions, land leveling, drainage, pasture improvement and management, farmstead windbreaks, recreation and wildlife measures.

Conservation education programs are available for schools, service clubs, youth groups and all people within the district.

Plant materials for trial plantings from Elsberry, Mo. Plant Material Center are also available to cooperators upon request.
