Session Content

- ◆ **Prescribed Fire Workshop:** The use of prescribed fire as a management tool, planning and implementation considerations and safety issues
- ◆ **Pond Management:** Pond building basics, fish habitat, stocking and population management, and weed control
- ◆ **Forest Management:** Techniques and considerations to aid landowners in managing forested areas for timber and wildlife
- ◆ **Small Game Management:** Small game habitat requirements and recommended management techniques and considerations
- ◆ **Property Rights/Wildlife Code:** Property rights relating to trespass and general information pertaining to the Missouri Wildlife Code
- ◆ **Turkey Biology & Management:** Land management techniques for better turkey habitat/production and an update on the ongoing Missouri Wild Turkey Research project
- ◆ **Native Grass & Forb Establishment:** Techniques and procedures for successfully establishing native grasses and forbs.
- ◆ **Invasive Plant Control:** Common invasive plant species that threaten Missouri's native landscape and recommended methods of control

Directions to Powder Valley Conservation Nature Center:

From I-44 West, take Lindbergh Road Route 61/67. Follow Rte 61/67 South to Watson Road. Go west on Watson Road to Geyer Road. Go north on Geyer Road 200 yards to Cragwold Road. Turn left and go 1 mile west on Cragwold to the entrance drive to Powder Valley Conservation Nature Center.

From I-44 East, take the Watson Road exit to the first traffic light. Turn left at the light and go north on Geyer Road 200 yards to Cragwold Road. Turn left and go one mile west on Cragwold to the entrance drive to Powder Valley Conservation Nature Center.
